## **Open World Programs in Cheyenne - A Great Success**

Friendship Force International manages two types of Open World programs: the Library of Congress Open World in Feb. – March and the Rumsfeld Open World in the fall. They are similar with delegates, who are young professionals, coming from Eastern European and Central Asian countries with emerging economies, and each program has a specific theme. They are different as the program length in the host city is nine days for the Library of Congress Open World, and five days for the Rumsfeld Open World.

John Kaiser has directed our club in hosting each type:

- ♦ **2016 Library of Congress Open World – POLITICAL PROCESS** theme for delegates from the Ukraine;
- ♦ **2017 Rumsfeld Open World – ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT** theme for delegates from Central Asian countries.

Our reputation for fine hosting is gaining momentum and backed by enthusiastic reports from Delegates! *Once again we have an opportunity to host Ukrainian legislators for a nine day program: Friday, February 9th through Saturday, February 17th.*

***John Kaiser has volunteered to organize the program; however, in order to accept the opportunity, we need a volunteer to organize the hosting for seven people.***
