SEPTEMBER PROGRAM REPORT



Balkans Rail Adventure

Our September 9th meeting was held in person at the First Christian Church in Loveland. Our speaker was Gerald Forney, President of the Denver Friendship Force Club. Gerry had a very interesting talk with pictures from his 16-day rail tour of the former Yugoslavia. Gerry

traveled with Irene Ludwig and Dave Bentzin. The majority of travelers were British as it was organized by a British travel company called Explore UK! The company runs the trip several times each month during the summer months, and costs approximately \$2,700.

Dave learned of the trip from reading articles in the International Travel News publication. This is an amateur magazine where the subscribers (rather than professional travel writers) are the contributors.

Former Yugoslavia is about the size of Colorado, and it forms the western third of the Balkan Peninsula. Yugoslavia was formed in 1919 at the Paris Peace Conference that ended World War I. Two of the defeated empires, Austro-Hungarian, and the Ottoman (Turks) gave up the land the formed much of modern Yugoslavia. It lasted for about 70 years and then broke up in a series of wars in the decade between 1991 and 2001. Today it comprises of 7 separate countries.

The rail tour started in the north, and gradually moved to the south. Yugoslavia had a single rail-way company, but after the break up there were eight different railroad companies. During the wars, many of the railroad connections between the new countries were broken. This meant the tour was a combined rail and bus tour. Gerry spoke of the different places they visited and the different conditions of the trains depending on the country. He ended with a time for questions.

Meet the Afghan Pilot Who Escaped Afghanistan

Many of us saw the chaos that was Afghanistan as our U.S. forces withdrew from Afghanistan. One of those who managed to escape eventually (and with his wife and 5.5 children) is happy and proud Fort Collins resident Qudratullah Hamidzai, who will be speaking to us at our meeting on October 14th. Don't worry about pronouncing his name; he's very content to be called Q; he understands us and loves us.

The former Afghan lieutenant colonel was the commander of MD530 SQ, Kandahar, and he also served as an interpreter for our forces there. He will tell you about those who helped him and his family escape, including U.S. Air Force Lieutenant Colonel Cory Fale, and he may be accompanied by some of the people who have helped him settle in Fort Collins, including someone from "his church" (I love that). I'm pretty sure he thinks of the United States as "his country" now, too. Some of us may remember that Lutheran Family Services is at the forefront of resettling such refugees, and Ken Weaver tells me that Friendship Force Denver is sponsoring an Afghan family. Another reason for us to grow?

You may have guessed that the Hamidzai family has a mama and a daddy and five children who hope to be citizens of the United States someday, but Q is proud to say that their baby daughter is an American citizen. They all LOVE Fort Collins and don't ever want to leave our part of the world.

NOVEMBER 11, 2022 PROGRAM PREVIEW

Jim Willard, Loveland Reporter Herald Columnist, is our guest on November 11, 2022 — Veteran's Day. Many of you may remember the entertaining program he presented a few years ago.

Jim's program is called "Home Front" and he shared the following with us:

"I am a decorated veteran of the U.S. Army Ordnance Corps. From June 1962 through November 1964 I served as Assistant (then acting) Nuclear Weapons Officer for the XVIII Airborne Corps in Fort Bragg, North Carolina. In that capacity I made two Top Secret classified courier runs during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Another role was as the Operations Officer in the Corps Technical Assessment of units able to deploy (and store) nuclear weapons. I was also the most junior officer in the Corps HQ Building at the time, a second then first lieutenant." He added "no one ever shot at me nor was I deployed to a combat unit."

Jim also offered to share a story or two after the main presentation about his experience as a junior officer with a Top Secret/Cryptological clearance.
